NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.25000 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of City of Snook.

PROPOSED TAX RATE \$0.25000 per \$100 NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE \$0.17437 per \$100 VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE \$0.23970 per \$100 DE MINIMIS RATE \$1.10693 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2022 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for City of Snook from the same properties in both the 2021 tax year and the 2022 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that City of Snook may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for City of Snook exceeds the voter-approval rate for City of Snook.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for City of Snook, the rate that will raise \$500,000, and the current debt rate for City of Snook.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that City of Snook is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2022 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON August 29, 2022 AT 5:30PM AT SNOOK CITY HALL 10245 FM 2155 SNOOK, TX 77878.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the voter-approval tax rate but not greater than the de minimis rate. However, the proposed tax rate exceeds the rate that allows voters to petition for an election under Section 26.075, Tax Code. If City of Snook adopts the proposed tax rate, the qualified voters of the City of Snook may petition the City of Snook to require an election to be held to determine whether to reduce the proposed tax rate. If a majority of the voters reject the proposed tax rate, the tax rate of the City of Snook will be the voter-approval tax rate of the City of Snook.
